Passing of Jessie Wagner

The Friends of the Orphan Schools and St John's Park Precinct Committee is saddened to advise that Mrs Jessie Wagner passed away on 8 January 2010 after a long illness. Jessie was a much-respected founding member of our group and served on our committee from its inception. She was devoted to the history and conservation of the Orphan Schools, and to St John's Church. Her commitment was expressed in many ways and she will be sadly missed. Jessie was highly esteemed in historical circles and was President of the Hobart Town and First Settlers Association from 2005–2010. A Celebration of Thanksgiving for her life was held at St John's Church, New Town. It was attended by Dr Dianne Snowden, our convenor, on behalf of the Friends group.

Forthcoming Events Fox's Feast Picnic Day

'Fox's Feast' Picnic Day will be held on Sunday 28 February 2010, from 11.30 until 3.30 pm. The main venue is the Old Sunday School building near St John's Church New Town (go to the left at the end of St John's Avenue, then turn right - the hall is on your left). All descendants and interested Friends are welcome to attend. Displays are being prepared and we will have experienced researchers

attending who will try to help you with any research queries you have. We will have a camera, scanner and computer to record any items of memorabilia that you are able to bring along to share with us. Please bring your picnic lunch and a rug or chairs for seating if the weather is suitable for outdoors. If the weather is not suited to outdoor dining, we can eat in the Sunday School Hall. There will be hot water available for making drinks. Joyce Purtscher will be taking a tour of the Orphan Schools area.

This event commemorates the annual summer picnic day for children at the Orphan Schools, which was funded from the estate of former convict John Fox. Fox arrived on the *Prince of Orange* in 1822 and received a conditional pardon in 1838. He never married and worked for many years on the Derwent River where he provided transport between New Norfolk and Hobart. At the time of his death in 1859 he bequeathed his estate of almost £500 to the Queen's Orphan Schools. He stipulated his bequest should 'stimulate the industry of the children and ... afford them at least once in the year a day of healthful and innocent recreation.' The first Fox's Feast was held in 1861 and then annually from 1865 until the closure of the Queen's Orphan Schools in 1879. Fox's Feasts were held at various locations including Cornelian Bay, the Cascades and New Norfolk. In 1877 the children

were treated to a return train trip from New Town to Brighton and in 1878 and 1879 they travelled in the steamer *Monarch* to New Norfolk.* The Fox's Feast tradition was revived in 2009 by the Descendants of Orphans Special Interest Group.

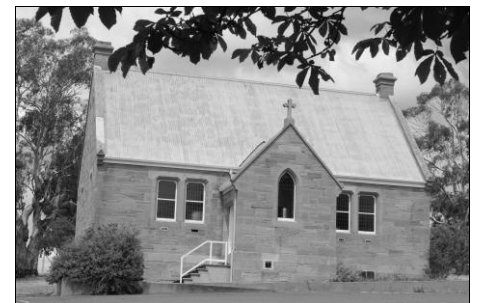
